He practices general urology, including diseases of the prostate and male genitalia, bladder and kidneys. His clinical interests include: general urology, stones (shock wave treatment, laser), keyhole surgery, laparoscopy, and alternative prostate treatments. His research interests include: urolithiasis, endourology, and benign prostate hyperplasia.
